Belgrade Bioinformatics Conference, 18 - 22 June 2018, Belgrade, Serbia

Dear colleagues and friends,

It is our pleasure to invite you to attend second Belgrade Bioinformatics Conference – BelBi2018, which will be held in Belgrade, Serbia, at the Hotel Palace, from 18 to 22 June 2018.

Several research institutions, faculties and scientific societies from Serbia have joined their forces to organize international conference focused on different aspects of bioinformatics. The overarching idea of the BelBi 2018 Conference is to illuminate different aspects of bioinformation systems, including theoretical approaches in modeling different phenomena in life sciences, information technologies necessary for analysis and understanding huge amount of generated data, application of computer science and informatics in precision medicine, microbiology, and plant science, search for novel remedies against debilitating diseases and drug development, and other similar topics. Therefore, the Conference aims to encourage the cooperation and exchange of ideas between scientists in related fields, with a special emphasis on regional networking.

Respecting the financial situation in most European countries, especially in the Balkans, and with a wish to attract as many young researchers as possible, the Organization committee manage to provide lower registration fees, particularly for students, and special accommodation prices for participants of the conference. The registration fee is 300 EUR for non-student participants and 200 EUR for students. For regional* participants registration fee is 100 EUR for non-students and 50 EUR for students.
